### [Explanation or possible meaning of some words from the inventory.

- clock reel = wooden device to measure the length of a skein of yarn.
- mantua = woman's loose-fitting gown.
- serge = very durable twilled cloth of worsted or a warp of worsted and weft of wool, mainly used for clothing but could also be used for bed curtains.
- tammy = fine worsted cloth of good quality, often with a glazed finish. Much mentioned in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, but obsolete by 1850.
- belly piece = a triangular stiffening of buckram or pasteboard - one sewn each to the lining on either side at about waist level, with the base of each triangle placed vertically along the front border to form a corset-like ridge down the "belly".
- quoif = a woman's close fitting cap, as worn under a veil by nuns.
- cob iron = irons for supporting the spit in front of the fire.
- kimboele = possibly the same as kimbael, a wooden tub made of upright staves hooped together and used for brewing, baking, salting bacon etc.
- ladder = can also be framework fixed to the sides of a wain to take a load of hay or corn.
- kids = bundles of faggots.
- fatts = vats, tubs, or casks.
- cooler = shallow pan in which milk, wort, or other liquids are set to cool.
- tems = a sieve.
- hovel = an outhouse without sides, framework for drying peas or hay, sometimes thatched.
- trache = possibly tearce or tearse, a cask holding 42 gallons.
- grate = framework of bars holding fuel, usually coal.
- cheese board = round board placed on top of cheese to press it down or table for cutting up the cheese or board for standing cheese on while maturing.
